- Provided 2049 volunteers, staff, religious and clergy with a Safeguarding workshop
- Informed 1642 people through the Diocese Safeguarding awareness program at parish masses, parish pastoral council, deanery, entity and ethnic chaplaincy meetings
- Coordinated 32 Parish Safeguarding reviews
