EXPLORING SYNOD

Don't be scared of the responses

Cardinal Mario Grech, Secretary General for the Synod of Bishops sent a message to a recent gathering of the bishops of the United States. His message was one of encouragement to listen at all levels of the life of the Church and to itself engage in this process of listening in order to discover the voice of the Living God.

"Do not be afraid to tell us frankly what you have gathered from listening to your people about what the Spirit is saying to the Church: to your Church and to the whole Church"

The Cardinal asserted that every contribution to the understanding of the Synodal Church is important.

He assured the Bishops that contrary to what many assume, there are no written conclusions; there is no desire to impose a line of thinking.

There is a willingness to listen to the Spirit in listening to one another. No positions are worth more than others. The Vatican encourages listening at all levels of the life of the Church from a wide range of experiences of walking with Church
