Safeguarding in 2023

As I look forward to 2023 I am beginning to plan the work I will be doing. In the latter part of 2022 with the lifting of Covid 19 restrictions I have focused on reengaging with parishes, completing reviews and facilitating many workshops.

My approach for 2023 will be to use a collaborative approach in providing Safeguarding workshops. This past year I have facilitated parish specific workshops which has worked well, however when numbers are low, not only is it not effective use of time, participants miss out on the wealth of knowledge from others. Please let me know your thoughts and how you would like your Parish Safeguarding Workshop run. For example:

- Would you like to join up with a neighboring parish?
- Would you like your parish to be part of a deanery wide workshop at a venue that can be accessed by all?
- Is there a particular ethnic group in your parish where we could adapt the workshop to be fit for purpose?

Please talk with your Parish Priest and in the New Year we can meet and discuss what suits your parish needs,

Volunteer agreements are also something I would like to focus on in 2023. These agreements are very good in providing boundaries and keeping our volunteers safe. Along with training, signing the code of conduct and police vetting they further strengthen the Safeguarding program throughout parishes and entities.

Police vetting continues to be a challenge for some parishes. Now that we are into our 4th year implementing the Safeguarding program Police vetting continues to be a vita component. Could I ask that everyone review their Safeguarding spreadsheet and delete those people who are no longer in ministry. Once you have completed that, please follow up with those volunteers either due for renewal and those who have yet to be vetted. Bishop Steve is clear in his expectations, Volunteers who do not have a current police vet can no longer serve in ministry. We cannot wait around for a 'what if' situation to occur. Please let me know if you would like a copy of the current Safeguarding Spreadsheet for your parish. Let us make this a GOAL for 2023, and join the 4 parishes in the Diocese who have a 100% Police vetting record.

The long awaited Safeguarding Induction video has been completed. I sent out the link in early November, this is just a gentle reminder that the purpose of this video is to give volunteers an opportunity to understand the Safeguarding processes prior to their attendance at a workshop. I have provided the link again for you below.
