Pumpkin & Chicken Pasta Bake

Ingredients

Butternut pumpkin, peeled and sliced into 1/2cm pieces - 600 g

Olive oil - 3 Tbsp

Paprika - 1/2 tsp

Onion, sliced - 1/2

Garlic, crushed - 2 cloves

chicken breast, skin removed and cut into 2cm cubes - 400 g

Creamy Pumpkin Soup - 500 mL

Spinach - 2 cups

spiral pasta, cooked - 200 g

Grated cheese - 1/2 cup

Basil leaves (optional) - 1/2 cup



Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced).

Place the pumpkin onto a lined baking tray. Rub with 2 tablespoons of oil and sprinkle over the paprika. Bake for 20 minutes until lightly browned.

While the pumpkin cooks, heat the remaining oil in a large frying pan. Add the onion and garlic cooking for 2 minutes. Stir through the chicken pieces browning lightly on all sides. Pour in the soup, bringing it to a simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from the heat, stir through half the cheese, and cooked pasta and fold through the spinach.

Pour the mix into a large baking dish, nestle the slices of pumpkin, sprinkle with remaining cheese and bake for 15 minutes.

Serve hot with a few basil leaves.

Baked Apple Sponge

Ingredients

Large apples, peeled, cored, chopped - 2

Large pears, peeled, cored, chopped - 2

White sugar - 2 Tbsp

Whole clove - 1

Slice lemon peel – 1

butter - 60 g

White sugar - 1/2 cup

Egg - 1

Self-raising flour, sifted - 1 cup

Low-fat milk - 1/2 cup

Ice-cream or cream, to serve



Method

Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced).

To make stewed fruit: Place 1cm water in a saucepan with sugar, clove and lemon peel. Bring to boil, stirring. Add fruit. Cook gently, covered, for about 10 minutes until tender.

Spoon stewed fruit into the base of a 20cm pie plate or casserole dish.

In a bowl, beat butter and sugar together until creamy. Add egg, beating well. Lightly fold in flour, alternately with milk. Spread evenly over fruit.

Bake for 25-30 minutes, until top is firm and golden. Serve warm with ice-cream or cream.

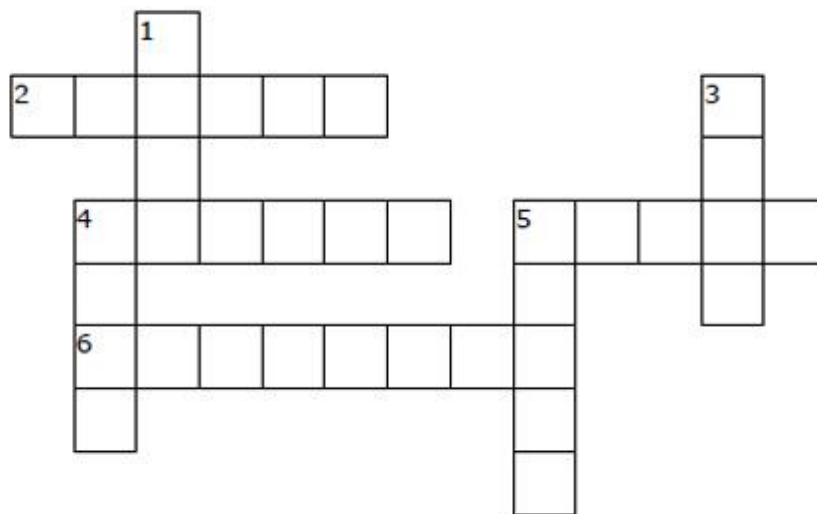
