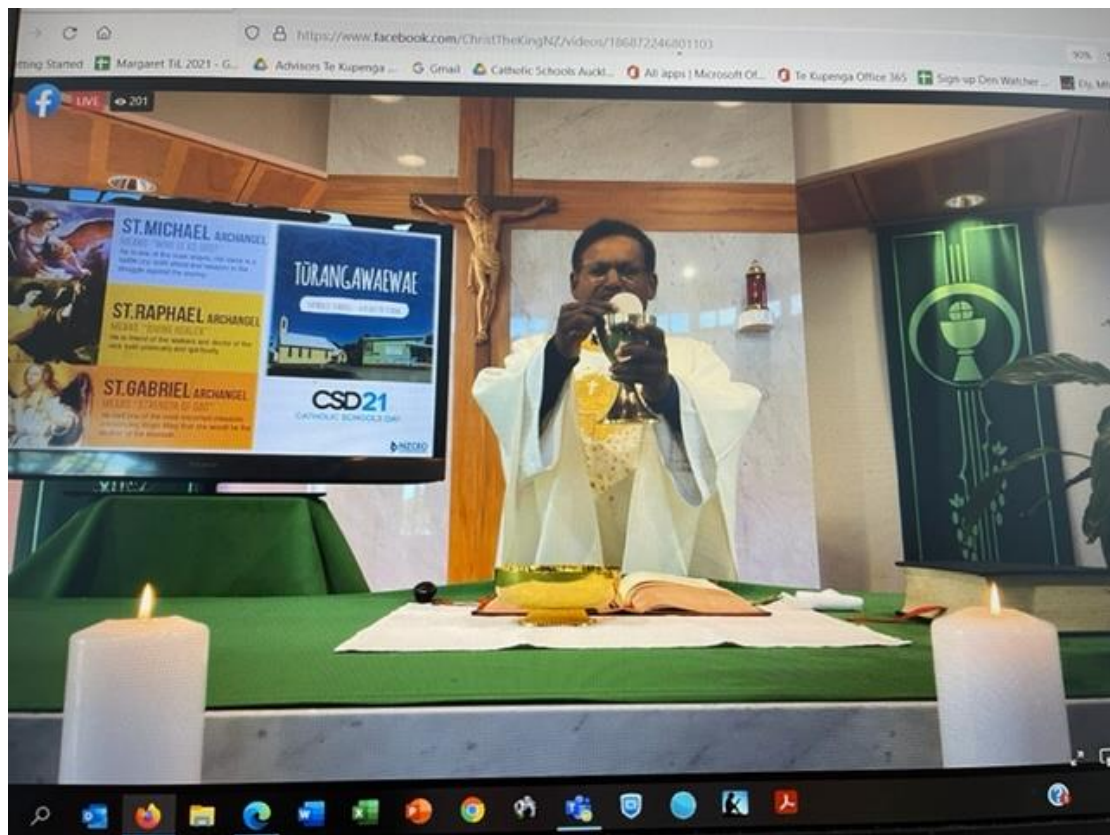

INTRODUCTION



Catholic Diocese of Auckland VISION STATEMENT FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

Recognising that Catholic Schools are integral participants in the evangelising mission of the church, a Catholic School will ensure students receive a quality holistic education that fosters: a genuine encounter with Christ; growth in knowledge of Christ, His teachings and the teachings of the Church; opportunities to become authentic witnesses of their faith.

Graduates from a Catholic school will therefore:

- ✚ Have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- ✚ Have an understanding of the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church
- ✚ Be witnesses of the faith through an authentic integration of faith and life, a commitment to serving others recognising the face of Christ in each person and being active members of a Catholic parish or Eucharistic community.
- ✚ Have the values, attitudes, knowledge/qualifications and skills that will enable them to move confidently to the next stage of their life, and become Missionary Disciples in the Catholic Church and in society.

KEY FUNCTIONS

Catholic Special Character:

Ensuring that the Catholic Special Character of our schools and Early Childhood Centres are safeguarded and enhanced.

Religious Education Curriculum:

Supporting schools in the effective delivery of quality nationally approved programmes

Professional Development:

Providing needs-based programmes which assist teachers and leaders to attain appropriate levels of Certification and qualifications associated with Special Character and/or Religious Education.

Leadership:

Assisting in developing and forming leaders in our schools and supporting staff already holding leadership positions.

THE BOARD

On July 1st 2002, the Proprietors agreed that the Catholic Education Services Board become responsible for the maintenance and preservation of the Special Character of the Catholic Integrated schools in the Diocese of Auckland and the provision of education services to Proprietors.

A Declaration of Intent was signed at this time. There have been some minor alterations to this document, and it was resigned on October 10, 2006, and again on September 11 2008. CESB & ACFL are considering an update in 2022.

DEDICATION AND GRADUATION MASS

HAVING LIFE TO THE FULL

This course is mandated by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops’ Conference to train teachers to ensure that the Catholic perspective is portrayed in the Sexuality & Relationship Education component of the Health and Physical Education Curriculum. Due to postponements because of Covid-19 Lockdowns, only two full courses were delivered as well as the first two days of a further two courses by Lyn Smith in 2021. 25 participants completed the requirements for Certification. This number includes 5 participants from Hamilton who are not recorded in tabled figures.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND OTHER COURSES

During 2021, due to Covid-19 lockdowns, several courses run by the Primary and Secondary Religious Education Advisors were postponed or were held via zoom. Others went ahead as planned. These included:

One advantage of this arrangement was that schools outside of Auckland in Thames and Northland were able to participate via Zoom with Auckland schools. In total, 764 school staff attended courses.

CERTIFICATE IN CATHOLIC EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

The Certificate in Catholic Early Childhood Education is a professional qualification which is recognised within the Catholic education system. The Certificate has been designed for people who are involved in early childhood education in a Catholic Centre, who are in leadership or aspiring to leadership in a Catholic Early Childhood Centre or who want to gain Certification from the National Centre for Religious Studies.

The Certificate consists of eight modules over two years and is facilitated by Christine Smith and the Religious Education Advisors.

In 2021 due to small numbers, no modules were offered. They are being offered in 2022.

BOARDS OF TRUSTEES

No training sessions were held for Boards of Trustees during 2021, due to Covid-19 Lockdowns in August, and a decision to review the type of training offered. Six Boards were supported in the appointment of new Principals.

SERVICES FUNDED

Logos

The Logos project is a Ministry to young Catholics in the Auckland Diocese that allows young people to celebrate being young and Catholic.

In 2021 Youth Workers provided restricted services because of Covid-19 Lockdowns:

- Retreats
- Training for Eucharistic Ministers
- Leadership Programmes
- Catholic Special Character Activities
- Sacramental Programmes
- Sacramental Chaplaincy

The Catholic Education Services Board continued to financially support this initiative of the Society of Mary providing \$15,000 towards their costs.

CATECHETICAL STUDIES

Catechetical Studies is offered to those students who are enrolled in pre-service education. Students undertake courses offered by the University of Auckland, Faculty of Education to assist them to teach Religious Education in a Catholic school. In 2021 five students attended the course taught by Lyn Smith.

DAY SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year the Catholic Education Services Board administer Day Scholarships for students in Years 9 to 13. In 2021, 34 students received these scholarships which pay for their Attendance Dues.

REVIEW OF REVIEWS

In 2021 the inquiry process into the way CES works with schools, begun in 2020, continued. Inquiry questions under the four headings Formation, Teaching and Learning, Te Tiriti o Waitangi and Community were developed. Hui to meet with Principals, DRS's and Board members were planned and the first two with Central Auckland schools occurred in August. Unfortunately, the long Covid enforced lockdown in Auckland from late August till December prevented further hui. The work is planned to continue in 2022, with other geographical groupings of schools.
