A liturgy of Repentance and Reconciliation

For fifty-five years the Methodist and Catholic Churches have been in ecumenical dialogue.

To celebrate this significant relationship the Methodist-Catholic dialogue of Aotearoa/ New Zealand held a liturgy of repentance and reconciliation at the Methodist Church in Takapuna on 25 October.



The most recent report published by the Methodist Roman Catholic International Commission, God in Christ Reconciling, offered the church the Liturgy for Repentance and Reconciliation which was adapted for this joint service.

At the end of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Paul VI invited a number of churches to formal theological dialogue. In 1966, the worldwide communion of Methodist and Wesleyan churches were invited and they held their first formal meeting a year later. The dialogue known formally as the **Methodist Roman Catholic International Commission** has met continuously since then. After 55 years of nonstop dialogue, the two communions are committed to the ongoing work of shared prayer, thoughtful listening, and engagement to continually ask

"What can we learn from one another to bring us closer to being the church that Jesus wants us to be?"



## Making International Connections

In the last week of October, St. Mary's Catholic Primary School, Ellerslie had the privilege to welcome 49 children and 15 adults from the Immaculée Primary Catholic school in New Caledonia. The visitors – some of whom were leaving New Caledonia for the first time in their life wanted to spend time with children their own age immersed in a school environment with opportunities to engage in 'English' conversations.

The children engaged in prayer time, classroom activities, shared mealtimes. and outdoor sports. The school principal organised a Sausage Sizzle for the visitors and host children brought food for a shared lunch.

The school reverberated with the sound of English and French being spoken. Google Translate was used to its maximum and it was interesting to see how communication was no barrier for the children. From both sides, there was manaakitanga, love, respect and acceptance.

A great life experience and learning opportunity for both schools.

## Robert Ned Covich Scholarship

On Tuesday 5th December an award ceremony for the recipients of the Robert Ned Covich Scholarship was held at the Pompallier Centre. The scholarship is awarded to a student from each of the Catholic colleges in our Diocese for three years of university study. The total received by each recipient is \$7500.

Robert Ned Covich was born in Croatia in 1933. His family emigrated to NZ and settled in Ahipara in the far North. Robert was grateful for his own education and the opportunities given to him particularly a scholarship to attend Sacred Heart College, Auckland. He studied as an engineer at Auckland University and was very successful.

Sadly Robert passed away in 1992 aged only 59 years. He left funds to establish a Charitable Trust to fund scholarships to support Catholic students through tertiary education. In 1996 the Robert Ned Covich Scholarship began and since then has supported approximately 380 young people. Students and their whanāu gathered with a deep sense of gratitude for Ned's extraordinary gift that continues to enrich the lives of so many.



Thank you to all who attended and participated in this great occasion. We are particularly grateful for all the effort put in to preparing the wonderful musical items.

It was an afternoon filled with singing, joy, and festivity. All proceeds went to the Caring Foundation's Christmas Appeal. We sure hope you had a blast and walked away with some inspiration for the Advent & Christmas season.

The diocese is looking forward to the evolution of this project, as more and more of our schools and parish music ministries/choral ensembles become involved. Let us build on this synergy that we have established!






Christmas Mass Times
