Message of Pope Francis for Lent 2024

On the 1 February Pope Francis gave his message for Lent. It is inspired by the passage from the Book of Exodus: "I am the Lord, your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery "(Ex 20, 1-17).

Pope Francis noted "The Lenten exodus helps us to free ourselves from slavery. God reopens our hope:
with an ecclesial, communitarian, and personal journey of conversion, to lead us towards the land he wants to give us"

In his Message, Pope Francis recalls that Lent "is a season of conversion, a time of freedom" because "God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters" and, citing the Book of Exodus, he emphasizes that the Word of God addresses each one of us personally today: "I am the Lord, your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery".

Along these lines, the Holy Father emphasizes that "it is time to act, and in Lent to act also means to pause. To pause in prayer,

in order to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of a wounded brother or sister" because "love of God and love of neighbour are one love".

The invitation consists, then, of "to pause in the presence of God beside the flesh of our neighbour. For this reason, prayer, almsgiving, and fasting are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, and he adds that "to the extent that this Lent becomes a time of conversion, an anxious humanity will notice a burst of creativity, a flash of new hope".

Ngā Tapuwae 2024 To first Mass Commemorations

More than 230 people gathered in 31-degree heat at Totara Point in the Far North on January 13 to mark the 186th anniversary of the first Mass celebrated on New Zealand soil.

Several groups attended the Anniversary Mass as a part of Ngā Tapuwae self-directed pilgrimages or visits. Among their number was a Wellington group from Caritas Aotearoa NZ, a group from the Sisters of Mercy in Auckland, and a group from St Francis Xavier parish, Whangarei.

Following a celebratory lunch, many travelled to the small church of Hāta Maria in Motuti - the burial place of Bishop Pompallier - to pay their respects, and to share the stories of the early days at the time of his arrival people who arrived from the local hapori in and around the Hokianga in 1838

Pope's representative at Waitangi Day and visiting Northland

As Apostolic Nuncio (Pope Francis' Ambassador to NZ), His Excellency Archbishop Novatus Rugambwa Rwechungura, is still recovering – the Deputy Head of Mission, Monsignor Giosué Busti, had attended the celebrations at Waitangi Grounds and in particular the Dawn Service at Te









Whare Rūnanga (Upper Marae). It was a very early start to the festivities of the Waitangi Day and the morning was charged with beautiful prayers, waiata, speakers' and crowds' reflections on the past, expectations for the present, and hopes for the future. In his karakia, Fr Busti alluded to the 'tree of healing' placed at the centre of the heavenly Jerusalem (as described in the Book of Revelation) and prayed for God's healing and blessings for all the people, the nation of this land. Amongst the dignitaries and distinguished guests, Fr Busti had also met with tāngata whenua, and in particular with

Hinerangi Puru-Cooper, of Panguru, daughter of land rights campaigner

One of the highlights for Fr Busti was his visit to Hāto Hohepa te Kamura, our primary catholic school in Waitaruke. Tamariki welcomed him with pōwhiri, kōrero and waiata. Fr Giosué (Pā Hohua) shared his





whakapapa and the link all priests, bishops, cardinals, and pope have with the first disciples and ultimately – with Jesus. He talked about the

'robe' and the different colours it might be. He spoke about Bishop Pompallier and the love he had had for this land and its people. Tamariki listened with attention, asked questions, and made a 'pūkana' to ngā mihi (thank) for his visit.

It was also very special for Fr Giosué to be able to celebrate Sunday mass at the National Shrine of St Peter Chanel in Russell. A few other representatives of the Diplomatic





Delegations were also attending. Wiga Autet from the diocesan faith formation team had shared with them the story of the saint and of the whare karakia.

Wiga was happy and privileged to accompany Fr Busti all along, to organise and facilitate his visit and meetings, taking him also to other beautiful and significant for our faith places in Te Tai Tokerau.

Ka kite anō, Pā Hohua. See you again up North, we hope.

St Ignatius of Loyola Catholic College in Drury Opens

St Ignatius of Loyola College officially opened on Wednesday 7 February with 340 Year 7, 8 and 9 students. The school will grow progressively to a roll of 900 by 2029, with students from Year 7 to 13.

Members of Ngāti Tamaoho and Ngāti Te Ata have been important stakeholders on this project. They have blessed the whenua and they led us through the powhiri on last Wednesday. When St Ignatius of Loyola formed the Society of Jesus and began the Jesuit mission of reconciliation with God – to accompany others finding find God in all things.

In 1997 a group of families in this area agreed to commit to a Catholic College. It is thanks to this group of people, the Catholic Diocese of Auckland, the Jesuit Order along with many other committed people along the way that this College has been opened. At the opening, principal Dean Wearmouth encouraged students and guests present to open our hearts to accompany one another on a journey to find God. To find God in ourselves, to find God in one another and to find God in our common home.

In the Opening Liturgy Bishop Steve reminded us this College is a place where we give greater glory to God. For us Christ is the living stone. He encouraged students to stay close to Christ and to build their lives on him. Bishop Steve said "Our hope and prayer is that when you leave this College you will be amazing young men and women – people who will go out into this world and make a difference because you have been inspired by Christ." Bishop Steve concluded by blessing crucifixes for each classroom and then moved through the College blessing each space.

The Inaugural Mass was celebrated on 13 February at the College, a joyful celebration of the Eucharist.
