He told the people to turn away from their sins and to ask for God's forgiveness.

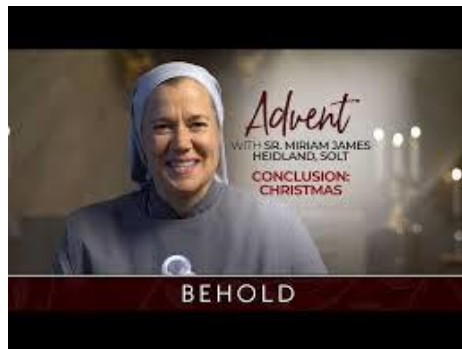
He baptised the people who were truly sorry and wanted to make a fresh start in their lives, and so he came to be known as John the Baptist.



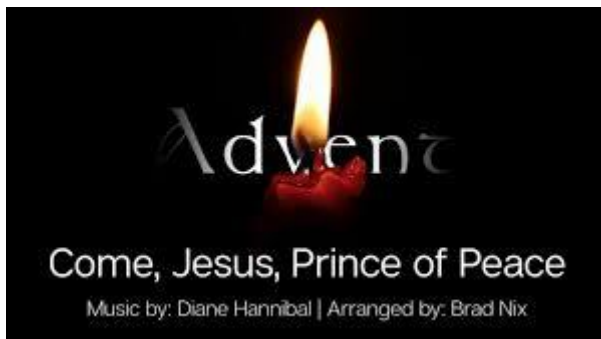

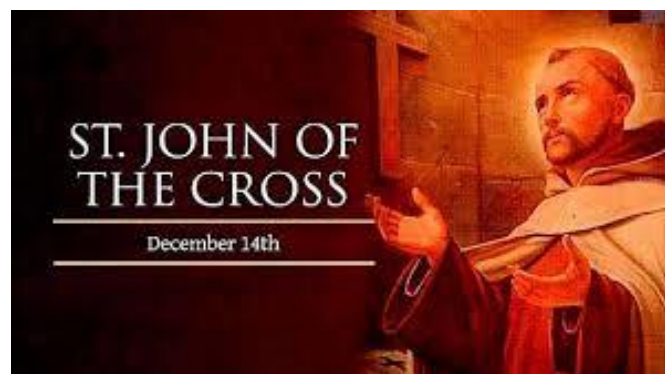

Potato, Broccoli and Tuna Bake

Ingredients

New season potatoes - 700 g

Olive oil - 2 Tbsp

Onion, sliced – 1

Garlic, crushed - 3 cloves

Broccoli, cut into small pieces -
1 head

Tin tuna - 185 g

Capers - 1 Tbsp

Salt, to season

Pepper, to season

White bread - 2 slices

Grated tasty cheese - 1/2 cup

Chopped parsley - 2 Tbsp

Butter, melted - 25 g

Milk - 1/4 cup



Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C, (160°C fan-forced).
- Boil the potatoes in a pot of salted water for 8 minutes. Drain and sliced into 1/2cm pieces. Place them into an oven proof baking dish.
- Heat the oil in a frying pan. Add the onion and garlic cooking for 4 or 5 minutes to soften. Add the broccoli and cook for a further 4 minutes. Remove from the heat.
- Gently fold the tuna and capers through the broccoli mix and season with salt and pepper.
- Break the bread into small pieces or place into a food processor until you get large crumbs. Put it into a small bowl and add the cheese, parsley, and melted butter.
- Pour the milk over the potatoes. Dot the tuna mixture on top, then sprinkle over the bread crumb mix. Place into the oven for 25 minutes until crispy and golden.
- Serve hot.

Best Peanut Butter Cookies

Ingredients

1 cup all-purpose flour, spooned and levelled

½ teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt*

½ cup unsalted butter, at room temperature

½ cup packed brown sugar

¼ cup granulated sugar, plus ½ cup for rolling

1 cup creamy peanut butter

1 large egg

1 teaspoon vanilla extract



Instructions

- Preheat the oven to 350°F and line two large baking sheets with parchment paper.
- In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, and salt.
- In the bowl of a stand mixer, beat the butter, brown sugar, and the ¼ cup granulated sugar until light and fluffy, 2 to 3 minutes. Add the peanut butter, egg, and vanilla and mix until creamy. Gradually add the dry ingredients and mix on low speed until just combined.

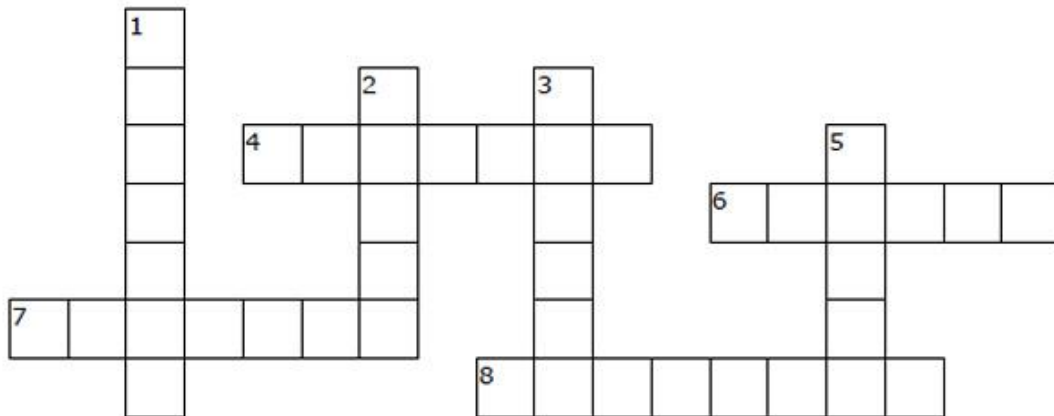
